NAN BLAKSTONE, 45, SINGER, COMEDIENNE
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CHICAGO, Sept. 25 (A)—Nan Blakstone, night club star who once was the "toast of Chicago's gold coast," died last night after asking that her eyes be given to an eye bank.

The 45-year-old singer, comedienne and pianist had been a \$1,000-a-week performer in Chicago, Paris and London night clubs before entering semi-retirement a year and a half ago.

Miss Blakstone, wife of Ronald Aaron Gerard, her manager, writer and producer, died in Columbus Hospital, where she had been taken Sunday after suffering a cerebral hemorrhage.

Her bequest of her eyes to an eye bank was prompted by sympathy for her mother-in-law, who died blind,

Born in San Antonio, Miss Blak-

stone attended Oklahoma University and later completed an extensive musical course at Chicago Musical College. A talented pianist, during her undergraduate years, she never played a note of anything that wasn't a musical classic. When Miss Blakstone launched her career as singer, comedienne and pianist, however, she built a reputation around her virtuosity as a "hot" musician.
